Cut to montage of advertisements for Nintendo Power Line.

INT. ADAM'S BEDROOM, GOLDBERG HOME, DAY.

INT. LIVING ROOM, GOLDBERG HOME, DAY. He runs downstairs to MURRAY sitting on the recliner. ADAM

MURRAY

ADAM But you don't even know what I was gonna ask.

MURRAY Would I have to pay for it?

ADAM Technically, but-

## MURRAY

ERICA and VALLEY ERICA walks downstairs.

## MURRAY (CONT'D)

You know, you could take a cue from your responsible sister. She's got a job and earning her way, not mooching from me like some kind of moocher.

ERICA

Yep, I definitely have a job. Certainly wasn't coming down to ask for some money.

INT. ERICA'S ROOM, GOLDBERG HOME, DAY.

ERICA and VALLEY ERICA go back upstairs to her room.

ADULT ADAM (V.O.) Turns out, that's exactly what she was doing. Erica had just lost her job at the Karaoke bar for reasons unknown and suddenly needed a stream of income, fast.

ERICA This sucks. I need a job just to stay in my crappy childhood bedroom.

VALLEY ERICA Yeah, I don't know what that feels like because I have my own place, but I bet that does suck. ERICA Wait, when did you get your own place?

VALLEY ERICA

Last week.

ERICA Why didn't you tell me?!

VALLEY ERICA I am telling you. Right now.

ERICA Well I need to get out of this house, mind if we go hang out there?

VALLEY ERICA Sure, I just finished decorating it and I've been looking for someone's face to rub it in.

INT. LIVING ROOM, GOLDBERG HOME, DAY.

They both walk downstairs and to the front door to exit. BEVERLY enters from the kitchen.

BEVERLY And where are you two headed?

ERICA We're gonna go hang at Erica's place.

BEVERLY Oh, Erica, you have your own dwellings now? How very responsible.

VALLEY ERICA Yeah, it's got a door man and everything. Plus his brother is a dealer so he can get you like-

ERICA casually elbows VALLEY ERICA.

VALLEY ERICA (CONT'D) A casino chip from the casino which is where he works because he's a card dealer which is probably a thing.
